

YEAR R



Reception have been learning their new routines in school. They have started fun phonics sessions and have been learning about what makes them special. Reception have been exploring Autumn and different signs of Autumn. Our favourite book so far has been the Jolly postman, we loved seeing who he helped!

YEAR 1

Yeah 1 have settled in well and are raising to the new challenges that Year 1 brings. In English we started the year by focusing on writing linked to No Outsiders, the children loved the story of Elmer. Our writing focus is on narratives and we have been writing using our author of the term, Oliver Jeffers and the story Lost and Found. This term our Maths units are: Place Value, Addition and subtraction and geometry. Our geography and history units have a focus on 'What is it like to live in Ellesmere Port? / How has Ellesmere Port changed?' We have enjoyed learning about what aerial view means and we are in the process of building up to creating our own maps. In RE we have been learning about harvest and also how not everyone has a good harvest and as Beacons, what we could do to help people who do not have a good harvest. We have enjoyed a forest school session which has helped support our season focus in science. We loved logging on to Purple Mash and have used this to platform to create some digital art based on the artist Hal Lasko.

YEAR 2

We have had a really busy start in Year 2. We have been learning about place value and have started to look at addition and subtraction in Maths. We have explored the city of London across both subjects in English and History so far this half term. We have read Katie in London and have studied information texts based on famous London landmarks. In History, we are studying The Great Fire of London!



YEAR 3

The children have had a great start to Year 3. They really enjoyed learning about the Stone Age, Bronze and Iron Age, with many of the children having an amazing time at the Burwardsley Centre on their Y3 Residential.

What the children said ...


I have really enjoyed the harvest festival because we to take on five more lines at the last minute.

- by telephoning the Authority on 0300 123 7039 to request a 'Starting School 2025-26' booklet.
