Reception have been working so hard again this half term! We have been learning all about different animals and their habitats. We turned into Polar Explorers, hunting for different animals to draw and write about. The Gruffalo came to visit and we made our own creatures in the deep, dark woods! We have finished our half term with learning all about dinosaurs, looking at how long ago they were alive and their different diets. We have been learning about the composition of 6,7,8 and we've been comparing numbers. We have loved our House of Dance sessions too!

YEAR 1

This half term, Year 1 have welcome in two new additions, our stick insects. The children have welcomed them in with open arms and even with some nervousness they have held them, looked at them closely and have been enjoying looking after them. We have had a wonderful trip to The Boat Museum with a focus on local history. We even had the opportunity to open the locks and created a huge floor map. After our navigation session, which included the Manchester Ship Canal and the Shropshire Union Canal. We had a lovely day!

YEAR 2

In Year 2 this half term we have started reading 'The Dragon Machine' by Helen Ward and producing some lovely writing based upon it. We've written a leaflet on how to fix a dragon problem and even written to our Headteacher about a dragon problem in our school! We've learnt how to count and add money in Maths and are now looking at multiplication and division. In Topic, we have been researching the continents and oceans of the world as well as looking at global climates and how the equator and the poles affect this. Finally, we have been testing and investigating everyday materials in Science – going around school to find examples of different types.

YEAR 3

We have been doing tricky Maths such as multiplication and Division. In English we have written Nonchronological reports about the African savannah. We have learnt how to use the internet safely including emails. Y3 really enjoyed all the mental health and wellbeing activities we did.'

YEAR 4

Year 4 have been learning about the teeth and the system in Science this half term. We recreated the system which was very messy but lots of fun! In English, been reading the book 'Escape from Pompeii' which has with our Romans topic.
